RWI phonic lessons
Begin to learn set 2 of the RWI sounds
Read cvc words by blending initial sounds eg cat, dog, hen
Spell cvc words by blending initial sounds eg hat, leg, man
Read and spell words containing set 2 sounds
Learn common exception words
Make predictions based on what has been read.
Read a variety of stories, poems and non-fiction texts.
Begin to read simple sentences containing common exception words and words that can be sounded out using the sounds taught.
Begin to read simple books
Listen and respond to stories about African animals and people who live in Africa – Handa's Surprise, Lila and the Secret Rain, Elmer
Ask and answer questions on the stories they listen to

Mathematics

Subitise numbers up to 5
Partition 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 into 2 groups
Combine groups to make 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6
Find ways to make 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6
Take away from groups up to 6
Take away up to 6 objects from a group
Identify one more and one less than numbers to 6
Identify which group has the most or the fewest
Compare and order numbers

Keeping Myself Safe - What's safe to go into my body (including medicines)
Safe indoors and outdoors
Listening to my feelings
Keeping safe online

Understanding of the World

Exploring what happens in winter
Investigating if water will freeze outside and how to get an object out of a block of ice
Learn about the animals that live in Africa – what do they look like, what do they eat, what do they do
What is our weather like?
What is the weather like where Handa and Lila live?
Find out about Chinese New Year – who celebrates it? How?
Use Google Earth to look at Woolaston – what can we see?
Look at other places in the world – what can we see on the image?
Talk about places that are special to them and ask the children to explain why
Begin to recognise that some religious people have places which have special meaning for them
Talk about the things that are special and valued in a place of worship
Begin to recognise that for Christians, Muslims or Jews, these special things link to beliefs about God
