RWI phonic lessons

Begin to learn set 2 of the RWI sounds

Read and spell words using set 2 sounds oo, ee, igh, ow, ay,

Read common exception words

Write simple sentences using the common exception words they know and sounding out other words

Read RWI books independently

Read a variety of stories, poems and non-fiction texts.

Begin to read simple sentences containing common exception words and words that can be sounded out using the sounds taught.

Listen and respond to stories – Where the Wild Things Are, Mr Underbed, The Tiger Who Came to Tea, The Jolly Postman, Leaf

Ask and answer questions on the stories they listen to

Make predictions based on what has been read.

Mathematics

Partition 7, 8 and 9 into 2 groups

Combine groups to make 7, 8 and 9

Find ways to make 7, 8 and 9

Take away from groups up to 9

Take away up to 9 objects from a group

PSHE

Discuss how we can help look after the special people in our lives and also our friends in school.

Identify how we can help at home and in the classroom.

Identify ways that we can help to look after the environment and the importance of caring for the planet.

Find out how we can look after our money and how some can be spent and some could be saved for something.
