Read and spell words using set 2 sounds oo, ee, igh, ow, ay,

Learn to read and spell words using RWI set 2 sounds oy, ou, air

Read common exception words

Write sentences using the common exception words they know and sounding out other words

Use fingers spaces, capital letters and full stops

Read RWI books independently

Read a variety of stories, poems and non-fiction texts.

Begin to read simple sentences containing common exception words and words that decoded using the sounds taught.

Listen and respond to stories – The Amazing World of Butterflies, Minkey Puzzle, Tad, Tadpole's Promise, Handa's Hen, Growing Story

Ask and answer questions on the stories they listen to

To identify how and when Christians like to thank God

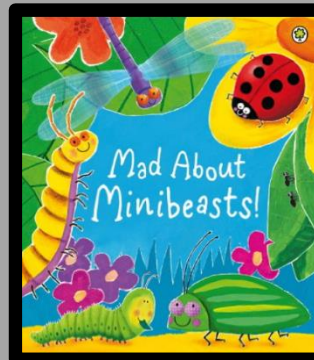
Talk about what people do to mess up the world and what they do to look after it.
