How can you help at home


- Please practice the phonic sounds and common exception words sent home as often as you can

- Ensure you pronounce the sounds correctly as this supports writing development




Spelling and Writing

Once children confidently know their phonic sounds they can begin to use them to spell. To do this we encourage children to pinch the phonemes (sounds) then to write the graphemes (the letter or letters that make that sound).
